PS.: After 2001 a further reorganization and reduction of the German forces meant the disbanding of 33, 34 and 36 bn and fusion of eight remaining Hawk Sqns with eight Roland Sqns to form the new Air defence groups no 11 (Leck AFB) ,12 (Sanitz,Cammin) ,14 (Burbach,Schöneck) and 15 (Leipheim). The HQ of 6 wing in Lengries was disbanded .The long planned concentration of 21 group in Möhnensee, Holzwickede and Lennestadt was modified . Bad Arolsen and Möhnensee were the only camps were the single squadron had to move. The plan to move 24 Sqn from Oldenburg AFB to Bad Sülze was confirmed and planned for 2005.

In 2003 the department of defence announced the complete disbanding of all Hawk and Roland units in 2004 and 2005 . The six Patriot groups will be concentrated in three close areas in Northern Germany (Leck,Husum), Eastern Germany (Sanitz, Bad Sülze) and Bavaria (Manching, Roth, Kaufbeuren) with one wing HQ each in Husum, Bad Sülze and Manching.. 21 group in Bad Arolsen and Möhnensee and 25 group in Ahlhorn and Barnstorf will have to move north and give up their sites and camps in Western Germany. 4 Wing in Burbach will disband, although a joint HQ for GE , US and NL SAM was established there a few years ago.
